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


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# **FIELD VISITS**


## Smart Phone Distribution (21\* April, 24)

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#### RAGGING IS AN OFFENCE REWARD IS JAIL

Ragging in any form by any student inside or outside the Innovative Institute of Law campus or half of residence is strictly prohibited. As per the judgement of Henourable Supreme Court ragging in any form is a punishable hemous crime. As per the latest amendment to UGC Pegulations on curbing the menace of tragging in higher educational institutions, ragging is defined as-

"Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence, and economic background".

Innovative Institute of Law has constituted Anti-Ragging Commutee and Anti-Ragging Squad for preventing ragging in college campus and in Hostel, CCTV cameras are installed at all locations known to be vulnerable to occurrences of ragging incidents.

#### ANTI-RAGGING MEASURES

#### PUNISHMENTS:-

As per the UGC and BCI following actions can be taken by the Institute depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institution. The possible punishments for those found grafty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:-

- 1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privilege
- 2. Withholding withdrawing scholarship fellowship and other benefits
- 3. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
- 4. Withholding results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- 6. Suspension expulsion from the hostel
- 7. Cancellation of admission
- 8. Rustication from the institution for the period as decided
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from primission to any other institution for a specified period
- 10. Fine ranging between Rupees 25 000 and Rupees 1 lakh
- Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the
  institution shall resort to collective punishment.

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
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#### SIMULATION MODULE

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

#### **ANTI-RAGGING MEASURES**

#### PUNISHMENTS:-

As per the UGC and BCI following actions can be taken by the Institute depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Commutee of the Institution. The possible printishaneuts for those found grafty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following -

- ( Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
- 2. Withholding withdrawing scholarship fellowship and other benefits
- 3. Debarring from appearing in any test evaluation or other evaluation process
- 4. Withholding results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festivat, etc.
- 6. Suspension expulsion from the hoster
- 7. Cancellation of admission
- 8. Rustication from the institution for the period as decided
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period
- 10. Fine ranging between Rupees 25,000 and Rupees 1 lakh
- Collective punishment. When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

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
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




#### Orientation Programme (21st Sep, 2020)


#### Webinar (31st Jan, 2021)
